- 1. What social and environmental factors almost caused the demise of the Jamestown colony? How did it revive itself?
- 2. Explain how the headright system encouraged migration to the New World, and the impact on migrants, their benefactors, and the region as a whole.
- 3. Compare the economies and slave systems of the Chesapeake, the Deep South, and West Indes.
- 4. Explain the role religion played in the founding of New England, and how it shaped the New World's first democracies.
- 5. How did the founding of the Middle colonies help create a more diverse and tolerant society? Consider religious, ethnic, and economic factors.
- 6. Explain how the triangular trade, the British Industrial Revolution, and the development of the American colonies were connected.
- 7. Explain why slavery developed differently in each region, and the conditions and events that caused the shift from indentured servitude to chattel slavery.
- 8. Compare the causes and impacts of the various European-Indian wars of the colonial period (Anglo-Powhatan War, Pequot War, Metacom's War, Pueblo Revolt)
- 9. What did Native Americans have to gain from participating in Imperial wars? (MQ p.90)
